Built in 1921 in Lunenburg, Nova Scotia. Originally built as a fishing schooner, Bluenose held the International Fisherman's Trophy Cup from 1921 to 1938, winning the race an unprecedented five times. Bluenose was sold in 1942 to the West Indies Trading Company and was lost off the coast of Haiti in 1946. A replica, the Bluenose II was built in the 1960's and is still sailing today.
